TITAN STAKES CLAIMS IN EAST ATHABASCA

Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, June 18, 2007 - Titan Uranium Inc. (TSXV: TUE) is pleased to announce that it has acquired, by staking, two claims in the Eastern Athabasca area, referred to as the Keefe Lake Property. The claims total 4,520 hectares and are located approximately 15km's SW of the McArthur River mine, the world's largest and highest grade uranium deposit.

The Keefe Lake Property was acquired to cover the strike extension of the basement conductor and structure that host uranium mineralization at the nearby Harrigan Zone (SMDI #2048). This basement hosted uranium mineralization was discovered in 1980 by Saskatchewan Mining Development Corp. (now Cameco). One hole intersected 4.0 meters grading 1.83% U₃O₈.

Titan has contracted Geotech Ltd. to conduct a state of the art airborne EM survey to be flown over the claims in July 2007 that will aid in defining targets for follow-up ground geophysical surveys and drilling.

Allan McNutt, Vice President Exploration reports: "*The potential extension of mineralization at the Harrigan Zone to the Keefe Lake property is very interesting to us. The Keefe Lake Property has not been drill tested and we eagerly anticipate the results of the airborne geophysical survey which is scheduled next month*".
